

General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) is the biggest overhaul of EU data protection law in over twenty years. The GDPR was adopted by the European Commission in April 2016 and comes into full force on 25th May 2018. GDPR is a dramatic change to the way the collection, access, use, storage, host and transfer of personal data is regulated. It will affect any business which has access to or processes the personal data of an EU citizen, regardless of where the business is located, inside or outside the EU. The extraterritorial nature of the regulation will be felt globally.

Organizations need to:

Recognise that GDPR is a legal compliance issue and not one that can be solved solely by implementing a technology solution

- Implement the right data privacy policies and processes
 and adhere to them
- + Minimise Personal Data collected they must have a justifiable reason to collect
- + Know where they store or hold Personal Data and manage it accordingly
- + Have the capability to exercise the 'Right to be Forgotten' wherever Personal Data is stored
- + Notify the regulators of a data breach within 72 hours

GDPR is first-and-foremost a legal compliance issue whose resolution can be supported through the use of appropriate technologies, once, and only once the appropriate processes are in place.


