



FEATURED STORY: THE PHILIPPINES



As Jona, 34, is a mother to three children in Iloilo, Philippines. Jona and her husband, Romel, work hard to raise their children. Romel seeks work as both a painter and farmer whenever he can find opportunities, while Jona cares for the children.

Two of their children, Kaithlyn and Kenlie, had the opportunity to enroll in Rise Against Hunger partner International Care Ministries' Home-Based Feeding Program. Through this program, participants receive nutritious Rise Against Hunger meals. Prior to receiving the meals, Jona's family primarily ate vegetables, including "lupo," a local vegetable that grows on rice lands, which are sometimes classified as weeds or grasses. When Jona had the funds, she would purchase fish for her family to eat.

"Life is very hard for us, but I pray we can eat well every day," Jona says. Despite her life's challenges, Jona has always hoped for something better for her children. She is optimistic that the Rise Against Hunger meals will help Kaithlyn and Kenlie reach a healthy weight. "I am so thankful for these meals," she says.

Pastor Rodne is the leader of International Care Ministries' Transform program, of which Jona is a participant. Pastor Rodne admired Jona's efforts to provide for her children but recognized that her family could benefit from the Transform program.



He shares, "Before, Kaithlyn was very thin and weak, but when the International Care Ministries program intervened, she became energetic and I can see that she has gained weight. I wish them good health and a blessed future."

He adds that the Rise Against Hunger meals have benefited the community overall, as community members are able to save money on food while

preparing to build a better future. Paster Rodne has seen children enrolled in the Home-Based Feeding Program recover from malnutrition.

Mae, a health trainer for International Care Ministries, shares, "My favorite part when distributing Rise Against Hunger meals is when I see the happy faces of participants receiving the food packs, and hearing their stories of how the Rise Against Hunger meals really help their children and families."

FEATURED STORY: ZAMBIA



Memory, a 15-year-old girl, lives in a rural area on the fringe of the capital city of Lusaka, Zambia. Despite her circumstances, Memory is a well-rounded student who carries herself confidently, has an impressive mastering of the English language and demonstrates drive, passion and a lively spirit.

While in school, Memory receives Rise Against Hunger meals and explains how vital they are for her. For herself and many of the children she attends school with, their daily meals at school are often their only meal of the day. These meals have also had a positive impact on her both physically and mentally. Physically, she has gained much of the weight she lost due to malnourishment, and mentally, she is now able to focus and excel in school. Before, she would often be distracted because of hunger or the thought of when her next meal would be. Now, Memory is confident she has a bright future as a teacher. She openly shares her passion for her nation and community and she hopes to one day be able to do for other children what Family Legacy has done for her. Memory says that without the help of these meals, she would not have been able to stay in school and develop her dream of giving back.

As Head Teacher of the Lusaka West school, Mwangala has gotten to see the change in support from family members and the community as a whole. Family Legacy provides educational and nutritional support to orphaned children in 22 impoverished areas of Lusaka Zambia. Because of the meals, many students have gone from being seen as a burden and another mouth to feed to a blessing that brings a good meal home.



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
